#### **Gratitude in Action**

My name is Marti, and I am an alcoholic. My sobriety date is July 27, 1990. When I came into Alcoholics Anonymous, I was mainly going to support my brother (who had a terrible problem). I surrendered that night that it was I who had the problem with alcohol. Who knew, that the first meeting I went to was the start of <u>my</u> journey of recovery.

I was not a daily drinker but when I drank and used, I did it with such fervor, as if it was my last day on earth. My husband and I had been arrested, so AA was the only reprieve from all my fears. At least for 1 hour, I could get out of my self and listen to the message. I was in such constant fear, it was a blessing to have the moment of reprieve.

What I have learned along the way is that we can get through ANYTHING, if we stay sober, one day at a time. My husband had to go to prison and I had to go to jail, but we did it sober! My sponsor told me that I needed to do the steps and immediately get into service. Those suggestions saved my life. I was rocketed into service and received the full benefit of that. I cleaned ash trays, made coffee, became a greeter, did the diverter for years, shared in Juvenile Hall and many other positions in between. So. When my sponsor dropped me off at jail to start serving my sentence, I did it with a changed heart- a servants heart....

Due to all the service work I had done previously; Elmwood had a special program where they would allow certain inmates to go out to AA meetings once a month. It was a pilot program and I was so excited to just be in an outside meeting at Alano East. Most of the other women who attended with me were not necessarily interested in staying sober, but some were and we supported one another on our recovery journey.

As I sponsor women, I too, 'suggest' that they get into service. Besides the steps, service has been the bedrock on which I have built upon and have found an enriched life. Regardless of life's struggles, it is the one thing I always go back to- Alcohol and drugs used to be my 'go to' for any life problems.... Service work is my 'go to' for life solutions. H&I has been the most rewarding of all my service positions because this is where I can be of maximum service to my fellows. It allows me to hold a bigger context about myself, my community and the world. Thank you for letting me be of service.

### SERVICE DESCRIPTON:

Provide a system to connect prisoners (with at least a year remaining inside) who wish to avail themselves of outside sponsorship with outside volunteers willing to perform that service on a continuing and at minimum monthly basis. Volunteers for the Inside Sponsorship Service are classified for entry into the institution as Visitors, not as Program Volunteers, and CANNOT also go into the institution as H&I meeting volunteers. By operating under the auspices of the NorCal H&I Committee, the goal is to provide the vital service of sponsorship to AA members on the inside, while avoiding conflicts with the rules and regulations of the CDCR and Title 15 of the CA Civil Code. Volunteer anonymity is protected through the use of a dedicated po box, and through cooperation on the part of the prison administration. The program is currently intended for use in Major Institutions but could be expanded to include other facilities where the population is confined for a relatively long-term period.

### **STRUCTURE**

### Volunteer positions within the IVSS are:

- IVSS Area Coordinator Liaison to local Area H&I Committee. see Section One
- **IVSS Institution Coordinator** Overall responsibility for IVSS program operations at a particular Institution.
- **IVSS Chair** Overall responsibility for oversight of IVSS program operations at Major Institutions in Northern CA. See Section Two, Steering Committee positions.
- Section 1, after Position Descriptions add IVSS Volunteer, IVSS Area Coordinator and IVSS Institution Coordinator
   <u>POSITION DESCRIPTIONS</u>

**IVSS VOLUNTEER (Section 1)** – meets one-on-one with an inside A.A. member to provide sponsorship (most State and Federal prisons restrict visitation to the weekends). The Visiting Volunteer is chosen by and responsible to the IVSS Institution Coordinator, *at his/her discretion*.

**Term**: no term limit, decided by sponsor & sponsee. **Qualifications:** Five years of continuous sobriety including knowledge and practice of A.A.'s 12 steps and Traditions. Solid sponsorship experience required; H&I experience strongly recommended. **Responsibilities:** 

- Attends initial orientation provided by Coordinator; reviews and familiarizes themselves with all materials.
- Completes 1-page visitor application Form 106 (provided through Coordinator) and submits to institution; informs Coordinator.
- Corresponds by mail with prisoner both before and after initial meeting.

- Pending CDCR approval, arranges initial visit and notifies prisoner by mail of visitation date; informs Coordinator.
- After initial visit, schedules and attends subsequent visits as agreed upon by sponsee and volunteer, but <u>no</u> <u>less frequently than once a month</u>.
- Shares experience, strength and hope in working the twelve steps of A.A. with the sponsee
- Keeps IVSS Coordinator informed on status.

 IVSS AREA COORDINATOR (Section 1) -The IVSS Area Coordinator is selected by the IVSS Institution Coordinator Recommended Term: Two years (may succeed themselves as selected by the IVSS Institution Coordinator).
 Qualifications: Two years of continuous sobriety including knowledge and practice of A.A.'s 12 Steps and 12 Traditions. Local committee activity required.

**Responsibilities:** is responsible for keeping local Area H&I Committee informed on needs and status of the IVSS efforts at the Institution served by the Areas, including but not necessarily limited to:

- Making the IVSS Institution report at Area H&I Business meetings.
- Liaising with other Area service committees (Inter-Group & General Service).
- Ensuring that copies of the IVSS flyer are available for H&I Reps to take to their groups.
- Ensuring that the IVSS Institution Coordinator contact info is listed on the local roster for openings; announcing during roster review.
- Serving as the informational contact point for IVSS inquiries at the Area level.

**IVSS INSTITUTION COORDINATOR** (Section 1 and 2) – The IVSS Institution Coordinator is selected by the NorCal General Chair with the advice of the IVSS Chair and the Regional and Area Chairs serving the institution.

**Recommended Term**: Two years (may succeed themselves as selected by the General Chair and IVSS Chair) or serves during term of appointing General Chair.

**Qualifications**: Five years of continuous sobriety including knowledge and practice of A.A.'s 12 steps and 12 Traditions. Solid sponsorship experience and committee activity required.

**Responsibilities**: is responsible for the overall program operation in a particular Institution or Facility, including, but not necessarily limited to:

- Recruits, screens and selects a sufficient number of qualified volunteers to adequately fulfill the inside requests for service, ensuring that volunteers aren't currently cleared as H&I meeting volunteers at the institution.
- Liaises with local Intergroups and General Service to assist in recruiting efforts and keeps service committees informed on progress.
- Establishes and maintains relationship with appropriate Institution staff, ensuring that A.A. principles of anonymity and confidentiality are upheld. Meets with prison staff as needed.
- Works with institution staff and Major Institution Coordinator where appropriate to resolve any issues which arise.
- Ensures that all volunteers are adequately informed about rules and regulations of the facility; conducts orientations and prepares informational packets.
- Provides to and assists volunteers in completion of CDCR Form 106, Visiting Request for Authorization
- Keeps accurate records of current volunteers, including contact info, availability and status of Visitation Authorization
- Provides prisoner application brochures & Form 106 to Major Institution Coordinator for distribution inside; ensures that volunteers have adequate supplies.
- At least weekly monitors po box to collect requests from prisoners
- Initially corresponds with prisoners on the status of their applications.
- Notifies volunteers of requests and identifies matches for initial visit; ensures timely action taken by volunteers.
- Performs post-visit follow-up and notes outcome of match or if another volunteer has been requested
- Regularly reports status of program to IVSS Chair.

**IVSS INSTITUTION COORDINATOR** (Sections 1 and 2) – The IVSS Institution Coordinator is selected by the NorCal General Chair with the advice of the IVSS Chair and the Regional and Area Chairs serving the institution.

**Recommended Term**: Two years (may succeed themselves as selected by the General Chair and IVSS Chair) or Serves during term of appointing General Chair.

**Qualifications**: Five years of continuous sobriety including knowledge and practice of A.A.'s 12 steps and 12 Traditions. Solid sponsorship experience and committee activity required.

**Responsibilities**: is responsible for the overall program operation in a particular Institution or Facility, including, but not necessarily limited to:

- Recruits, screens and selects a sufficient number of qualified volunteers to adequately fulfill the inside requests for service, ensuring that volunteers aren't currently cleared as H&I meeting volunteers at the institution.
- Liaises with local Intergroups and General Service to assist in recruiting efforts and keeps service committees informed on progress.
- Establishes and maintains relationship with appropriate Institution staff, ensuring that A.A. principles of anonymity and confidentiality are upheld. Meets with prison staff as needed.
- Works with institution staff and Major Institution Coordinator where appropriate to resolve any issues which arise.
- Ensures that all volunteers are adequately informed about rules and regulations of the facility; conducts orientations and prepares informational packets.
- Provides to and assists volunteers in completion of CDCR Form 106, Visiting Request for Authorization
- Keeps accurate records of current volunteers, including contact info, availability and status of Visitation Authorization
- Provides prisoner application brochures & Form 106 to Major Institution Coordinator for distribution inside; ensures that volunteers have adequate supplies.
- At least weekly monitors po box to collect requests from prisoners
- Initially corresponds with prisoners on the status of their applications.
- Notifies volunteers of requests and identifies matches for initial visit; ensures timely action taken by volunteers.
- Performs post-visit follow-up and notes outcome of match or if another volunteer has been requested
- Regularly reports status of program to IVSS Chair.

**IVSS CHAIR** (Section 2) – appointed by the General Chair with the advice and concurrence of the General Committee

Term: Serves during term of appointing General Chair.

**Qualifications:** It is suggested that the IVSS Chair have a minimum of five years of current and continuous sobriety and prior experience on the committee.

**Responsibilities:** Oversees and assists IVSS Institution Coordinators. With the General Chair and Major Institution Chair, establishes and maintains best possible relations with correctional professionals of major institutions in Northern California.

- Assists General Chair in appointing IVSS Coordinators. Serves in support and advisory capacity to IVSS Coordinators; helps to ensure continuity between outgoing and incoming Coordinators. Assists in resolving problems
- Maintains master list of contact information for inside personal.
- Works to ensure that key personnel of Major Correctional Institutions in northern California are informed about our committee and when appropriate liaises with PI-CPC and Bridging the Gap committees to that end.
- With Major Institution Chair (or Major Institution Coordinator) and IVSS Coordinator, meets with Wardens and Staff of Major Institutions in Northern California to present sponsorship service.
- Reviews and updates program guidelines as necessary

**Major Institution Chair, Carl Price** (present) He visited the new Area Chairs and has a new Pelican Bay Chair (Cindy Boozer) and FCI Dublin chair (Linda Spencer).

- ASP Avenal (Doug Godall). Verbally provided by Carl. He still needs volunteers and at least one meeting per week has been covered.
- CCC Susanville (Raymond Laurie)
- CCWF & VSP Chowchilla (Miki Smith). Per Carl, there is nothing that has changed much from the last report. Facility held a banquet for the volunteers which was nice to see.
- **CHCF Stockton** (Melody Tolmie). Verbally given by Carl. Everything is going smoothly until December, when all the program groups were cancelled by the facility due to staffing issues. They got rolling again.
- **CMF Vacaville** (Ken Monson). Inmate attendance is good. 24 meetings/mo and all meetings are covered. Started attending ``The Ranch" meeting (minimum security) facility) and 3 volunteers covering the first 3 Tuesdays of the month. Volunteers are being turned away because of the lack of inside staff to escort volunteers, so Ken has been talking with the CRM to resolve.
- **CTF Soledad** (Peter Ortez). Peter said things are going well at the North and South facilities. There are 5500 inmates housed by 3 facilities. Not allowed to go in in December. Central facility was being terrorized by the 'Bulldogs". Peter made some helpful suggestions to separate meetings to address gang issues.
- **DVI Tracy** (Kevin Weakland). Per Carl, things are going well, but things are in transition at this facility. December was a blackout. A high number of attendees find it difficult to hear and it continues to be a challenge. We still need volunteers. It was suggested that for reception inmates, that they use New Freedom and Hope videos and have volunteers there to answer questions. This may provide those inmates with needed info and kick start AA for them.
- FCI Dublin (Linda Spencer). Verbal per Carl- She is the new Chair. Carl will get her information to Marti to be added to the roster. They are not issuing new clearances, and it is still hard to get in there because the inside sponsor is so busy and cannot escort volunteers. They have 9 volunteers that cover 8 10 meetings a month.
- FCI Herlong (Currently covered by Reno) No report
- FCI Mendota (Rodney Lawley) The Federal system is undergoing some changes and he has not been able to go for a month. There are 2 meetings, each on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month. Meetings are somewhat sporadic at the prison, but AA has a good relationship with the staff. The inmates are actively grateful.
- **FSP Folsom** (Andrew Burkard): 16 cleared volunteers covering ½ of the 44 meetings across 3 facilities (Main Men's; Minimum Men; Minimum Women). 6 of the 18 volunteers are covering multiple meetings. Due to CRM staffing issues, no applications have been processed since September 2019. They are moving to a quarterly processing cycle and include a 2 hour onsite orientation with next one to be in 02/20. 38 have been given applications, 2 have submitted. CRM attempting to streamline the process. Several inmates wanted outside sponsors. All inmates with parole hearings have been reporting that the board constantly asks them about AA and what they understand the steps to mean. Andy is trying to get some better communication going between prison and inmates.
- HDSP Susanville (Raymond Laurie) (no report)
- **MCSP Mule Creek** (Mike Kelley): Facility has gone through several personnel changes in Community Resource Dept resulting in delays in scheduling meeting participation and the application/renewal process. Some yards have been without H&I participation for some time. A new CRM started in January and a Staff sponsor has been found to revive the meetings.
- **Napa State Hospital** (John Glaser) Per Carl, John is stepping down and there is a new person for this position, but he is going regularly for now.
- NCYC Stockton (Position is OPEN, no report)
- NorCal Fire Camps (Peter Sanderson) (absent, written report) No clearances have been granted since late August 2019. This may possibly be due to the complexity of the current process multi page application and require online training). 19 renewals coming due from Feb-May 2020. Region and Area Chairs- Please make sure your camps in your areas are staffed. Not Staffed: Alder, Ben Lomond; Eel River and High Rock. Chamberlain Creek and Parklin are dark since there are no male volunteers to accompany women volunteers. Ishi, Salt Creek and Valley View will go dark in Feb if renewal requests are not made.
- **PBSP Pelican Bay** (Cindy Boozer): Meeting with Carl and Jeff was very informative and helpful to everyone. Have been working with staff at Pelican Bay to start a routine of routing volunteers to the various meetings to provide inmates with a larger view on how the program works. Renewed 4 volunteers with lapsed clearances and 2 new applications. 6 of the meetings covered for January.
- **PVSP Coalinga** (Tommy Redwine). The meetings are the 3rd Thursday of each month at 6 pm. We are invited to 4 cell blocks, average attendance of 20. 3 volunteers have been cleared. No yards were available for visits in December 2019.

- CSP Sacramento (John Carboch) (no report)
- SATF & Corcoran (Bill Hartzman). Written report. Volunteer Advisor Committee meetings have not been held since March, 2019. 4 volunteers have been approved to serve at Avenal SP with Doug. SATF: 9 meetings monthly led by 6 of the 26 volunteers that have been cleared and are held Mon-Wed. The renewing volunteers will be transitioned to Brown Card holders, extending access to 5 years. A new CRM has been hired. COR: Expanded meetings to 4 monthly meetings (Mon-Wed) led by 2 of the 21 cleared volunteers. 3 volunteers are due to renew, 2 pending approval. Very good relations with the CRM staff.
- SCC Jamestown (Jason Crow) (no report)
- SOL Solano (Lidya Padilla). 12 meetings a week to cover, short on volunteers, but meetings are being covered. We were told to expect some changes in 2020, they are considering moving things around and adding more educational classes. The Spanish group may be affected.
- SQ San Quintin (Bob Wright). Some lockdowns and we have coverage issues for Spanish speaking meetings. We do not have enough volunteers, and those with gate clearances haven't renewed them; 3 lost their gate clearances. We have 4 Spanish speaking BC holders, 1 does not speak any English, so it is difficult to communicate. Going from 2 to 1 Spanish meeting. CRM advised that the beige card will be due at the holders birthday month, not the anniversary of the BC issuance. This should make it easier to track.
- **SVSP Soledad** (Allison Goss). Written report. Level 4 prison meetings are held on Wednesday in 6 yards. Most meetings are Book study. We started seeing some of the regular meetings attended by 70% non-alcoholics, so this caused us to ask Warden to get AA back to basic. We have started non-Prop 57 meetings on Saturday on 2 yards with good
- USP Atwater (Dawn Trook). Written report. No changes from last report. The prison was on lockdown often, but the spaces are held open for meetings and inmates were grateful. Prison will be having a new warden, so things may change.

**IVSS Chair, Karen Czujko.** Pilot program in San Quintin providing outside sponsors for inmates. They can enter prison as a visitor, not a volunteer, so they do not have to follow the same rules/requirements of a volunteer. Handouts are available about the program and a more complete program description is on the website. In March 2019, we had our first visit of a sponsor to an inside sponsee. So, it has been operational for about 10 months. Phase I: completed (preparation phase). Phase II started (implementation). Phase III is ongoing (tracking/reporting). In less than a year, we have completed 39 matches; 15 potential matches; 9 prisoners on the waitlist. Less than 1 year, 63 receive or registered to receive outside sponsorship. Phase IV: Adoption by this committee and included in Policy Manual. At the National Corrections Conference, the Senior editor of the Grapevine magazine asked us to submit a series of articles. They are looking to publish articles in four separate issues. Looking to begin in July with the prison issue. Since 1942, we have been bringing in literature and meetings, and now we are able to bring Sponsors to the prisoners.

**Finance Committee Chair, Karen Bertolini** (present). I started in December 2019 and I want to thank Karen and Jeff for their support. I have access to WFB accounts online and Karen has been sending me checks to sign. Pink Can Letter was not ready in time for the newsletter publication, but will make sure it will go out on time going forward. We came close to budget over all. Our committee expenses continue to be under budget, meaning that we are not availing ourselves of the reimbursements available for mileage, etc. December 2019 contributions were over budget due to bi-annual contributions coming in sooner than expected. We had an error in the pink can expenses.

#### NCCAA Conf. Coordinator, HE Nelison (absent and no report)

**Literature Chair, Kelly Bennett** Pink Pamphlets are ready, however there was a mistake on the Spanish section I and II. It says 10/18, should be 10/19. We have had an issue for the last couple of months by not receiving Form 2, missing about half of them. Per Policy Section II, Page 17, we need prior to dispersing literature. Important to keep roster updated so literature is going to the right address. Chair to send out to Regionals and Area Chairs as a reminder.

**Region 190: Spanish South Interior, Rafael Flores** (present) I was elected after being treasurer for the last 3 years. Fresno Jail: Meetings every Friday, 4 meetings held on different floors with an average of 20 inmates attending. VSP Woman's Chowchilla: Every Wednesday with an average of 38 attending. VSP Men's Chowchilla: Meetings every Thursday with an average of 50 inmates attending in gym and 50 men in the Visiting room. Our Home Hispanic Recovery: Meeting every Wednesday and maximum allowed is 12. Average in attendance is 8-12. The Committee is visiting an average of 9 groups per month to provide information and motivation to join the committee.

#### **Liaison Reports**

#### VATF Carl Price (present)

During the VATF meeting held in December, many topics were discussed. Secretary of CDCR visited prisons in Norway and was impressed by the humane aspect of their approach. He is looking at the DOM for outdated, inhumane and irrelevant policies. Implemented the Substance Use Disorders Treatment Program for CA prisons. Inmates will receive medical referrals, which may impact us for time/space conflicts. Another CDCR official indicated how inmates can be transformed, and that volunteers are critical in that process. The Chief of Rehab programs spoke about innovative program grants. The Head of Policy Standardization discussed having a seamless gate clearance process. He indicated the importance of volunteer coordinators meeting with Wardens, communicating with CRMs or Inside sponsors and attending VAC meetings. Another topic discussed was Integrated Substance Abuse Treatment". It is an intensive outpatient module of 2 hours per day, 5 times per week for a year. After that, it will be 2 hours, 3 days a week for another year. Nurses will follow each patient. This is based on the disease model of addiction and the department will train CO's and parole officers.

Clearances: The standard for getting VIC (brown card) is 6 months experience as a gate clearance holder in the prior year. CRMS are charged with notifying providers ASAP with any program changes. TB testing: required to be done annually and a chest x-ray for those who have been exposed but aren't positive, a letter from a doctor is good for 5 years. All medical info is locked and secure. VIC: This still requires the annual 8 online training modules to be completed and onsite training. The LiveScan and app must be completed prior to the orientation. We did ask about possibly offering the training in Spanish and this will be considered.

**H&I Liaison to CNCA Karen Bertonli** (present) CNCA Area Oct/Nov meetings cancelled due to fires and facilities used as evacuation centers. We may want to think about how we are going to service the incarcerated in the era of wildfires. The Assembly proposal was passed to request Trustees to add to their agenda, a proposal for the 5th Edition of the Big Book.

#### COMMITTEE CHAIR REPORTS

**General Chair, Jeff Little.** We want to thank Area 93 for hosting the General Committee. **Financials**: Fiscal year begins 1/20. For January, 2020, Contributions up 21.1%; literature expense up 57.6%. Total expenses up 59%. Year to date comparison to budget: up 31.6%; contributions down 1.4% in literature expense. We are down 2.6% in total expenses. Overall, the financial condition is excellent. Keep ordering literature, we like to see literature expenditures to be about \$17-\$20 per meeting.

Form 2's: Important to get Form 2's in, to date, received about 60% of them.

**Committee Meetings:** Steering Committee, May 2020 will be held at the William St. address in Vacaville. The General Committee will be held in Del Norte area in June, 2020.

Other updates: The Policy Committee is active and working on 2020 proposed updates. We will be looking closer at The IVSS Sponsorship program.

Financial situation is excellent. YTD contributions are inordinately high due to timing of A73, Santa Cruz bi-annual contribution which would normally have come at the end of 2019. –We only have 2 mos data so numbers are skewed.

For mileage expense, either attach a mapping screenshot or put the destination address in the description line. All other expenses need documentation attached to the request. Regionals need to submit travel to Areas so we can track the actual cost to perform your service position.

**Secretary, Martine Anshutz.** When sending in reports, it is important when sending in reports, to include your respective region/area and indicate the meeting you are referencing (Steering vs. General).

**Rosters:** If any changes are in your region or area, PLEASE make email information to <u>northcalhandi@gmail.com</u>- we need the new person's name, email, phone and mailing address.

**Major Institution Chair, Carl Price. Form 2:** It is very Important to send them in. New coordinators at Pelican Bay and FCI Dublin and I need to get out to more of the institutions. TB X-ray tests are now good for 5 years.

**IVSS Chair, Karen Czujko. Pilot Program** to provide outside sponsorship to prisoners at San Quentin. Volunteers for the Inside Sponsorship Service enter the institution as visitors, not as Program Volunteers, and therefore don't have to follow the rules for prison staff as regular Program Volunteers do. This is not an attempt to "manage or organize sponsorship", just to make outside sponsorship available. Individuals only need to fill out a visitors clearance. Originally presented at 06/18 meeting. **Phase 1:** Completed. Preparation & had 1<sup>st</sup> volunteer orientation a year ago. **Phase 2:** Started 3/19, operational for 11 months. **Phase 3:** Tracking and Reporting is ongoing. Completed 40 ongoing matches; 21 potential matches and 4 prisoners on wait-list. 65 prisoners currently receive or register to receive outside sponsorship. Growth rate has plateaued as we anticipated. **Phase 4:** Adoption by Committee. First Policy Manual drafts submitted for 2020 Policy Manual proposals will be in May/June meetings. GV Project: After the National Corrections Conference in TX, we were asked to submit articles to Grapevine- 3 volunteer & 1 prisoner articles submitted. A few more articles in process. I wrote a cover article and anticipate publication in the June/July edition. Since 1942 we've been bringing in meetings & literature but until now, we've never found an organized, sustainable method to provide sponsorship without breaking the prison's rules. Andrew Keirns asked if there is a plan to roll out to other areas- not as of yet so we can work out glitches. It may take at least another year to roll out.

**Finance Committee Chair: Karen Bertolini** Pink Can Letter was delayed due me and in part to the missing Form 2s. **Budget:** We are close to budget overall and AAWS is about \$3k under budget but expected to come in line with receiving healthy orders. Received \$20K contribution in 12/19 which normally comes in in Oct/Nov timeframe which skewed numbers. We need to submit our reimbursements.

**NCCAA Conference Coordinator: H.E. Neilson.** Spring Conference in San Jose 3/13-3/15/20. San Jose will be electing new NCCAA. San Ramon conference lost over \$7K due to block rooms not filled, NCCAA conference being shaved down to 2 conferences/year and overall, conference is at risk. H.E. is stepping down, the position is now open.

**Literature Chair, Kelly Bennett.** For orders, text, email or call if you want to order. Must submit Form 2 prior to receiving any literature. Suggest that focus on distributing Grapevine Books (English and Spanish) to long term areas (these are different from Grapevine magazine).

**Pink Can Coordinator, Peter Mitchell.** We have 1013 pink cans. To order, text or call Peter.

**Policy Chair, Woody Roderick.** The printed policy manuals have an error, failed to update the year from 2018 to 2019 on the Spanish Section 1 and Section 2, and some of these manuals were shipped before change could be made. If your Region or Area received

any new Spanish Policy Manuals without the correction, update the year on the cover page, but any new printings will have the correct year. The 2019 versions of the Spanish and English Policy Manuals are available on the H&I website. Suggestions for revisions to the 2020 Policy Manuals are being considered for presentation and discussion at the next Steering Committee meeting in May 2020. It is important that H&I volunteers be familiar with the structure and general guidelines in the Section One Policy Manual. Please encourage all Area Chairs to include at least one orientation each year to help volunteers to understand their responsibilities as members of the H&I committee.

Audio Media Chair, Joseph Bennett. Our library of cassette tapes need to be converted to mp3. Any volunteers would be greatly appreciated.

Region 20- Northern Coastal, Jess Young. Area 21- Mendocino, no report. Area 22- Sonoma, Steven Hammerich. The H&I Area 22 business meeting orientation is 30 minutes prior to the business meeting and is held at the Community of Christ Church at 1495 Steele Lane. .Area 23-Lake, no report.

Region 30- Northern Interior: Marty Gouvea. All Form 2 should be in. Area 31- Glenn Butte, Jim Lawler. 34 meetings/month. Rebuilding after fires. 3-4 new volunteers at Jan. mtg. Trying to attract more volunteers (Glenn) with updated pamphlets and a workshop. Trying to revive both county jails' mtgs.(Butte). Area 32- Plumas, Michael Bonnett. 6-8 mtgs./mo. All is well. Using Reno Intergroup for Lit. & support. Area 34-Placer, John Adams. 72 mtgs./mo. 5-6 dark nights due to holidays & lockdown. Trainings for county Jail volunteers announced. Auburn FWP has issues/questions with pink can use at their mtgs. Thanks to Karen C., it should be resolved soon. Area 36- Nevada Sierra, Rick Calais. 32 mtgs./mo. New group reps. & volunteers. Trying to revive county Jail & Juv. Hall mtgs. Updating local pamphlet & facilities list.

**Region 40-Central Interior, Terry Docherty.** (absent, written report). Attended Area 45 in January and will attend other areas in February, 2020.

**Region 50-East Bay North, Peter Mitchell.** All Forms 2 are in for this region. **Area 51**- Napa, 10-15 different facilities, includes Napa State Hospital. Meetings well attended. **Area 52**- Contra Costa. No update. **Area 53**, Alameda. 50 different facilities, 300 volunteers, going well. **Area 54**, Solano. Includes 2 prisons in Vacaville and County jail in Fairfield, all is running smoothly.

**Region 60- West Bay SF, Julio Barba** (absent, written report). **Area 61-** Marin: Stable and doing well supporting 15 meetings/week, unchanged from 2018. The need for volunteers for the Inmate Visiting Sponsorship Service pilot at San Quentin is regularly discussed at business meetings and mentioned in monthly committee emails. Area reviewing their local area policies in an effort to improve transparency and accountability by documenting several long standing, but previously undocumented local policies. These policies address coordinator and volunteer responsibilities and how volunteers ascend from alternate to regular positions. **Area 62-** San Francisco: Penny Cooke. Supporting 56 (down from 60 reported in 2018) meetings per week. Clearance procedures have changed and are more difficult to complete and 25% of the volunteers at S.F County Jail #5 have left 40 vacancies. Working on increasing the number of H&I meeting reps and their level of participation. Progress has been slow due to turnover and vacancy of the Outreach Coordinator, which fortunately has recently been filled. They are also looking for ways to improve the participation of meeting coordinators and are open to suggestions from areas that have a consistently high level of participation by their meeting and facility coordinators. The Area needs many more volunteers and has added a quarterly orientation at SF-Marin Central Office in addition to the monthly orientations held at the Mission Fellowship. **Area 65-** San Mateo Chair: Mark Woods/Joey DeMartini (co-chair): The area is stable and doing well supporting 39 (up from 36 reported in 2018) meetings per week. and is in need of more volunteers to fill several current openings.

**Region 70- Southern Coastal: Raymundo Lujano** (absent, written). **Area 71-** Troy Joseph: 55 meetings, 500 volunteers and the business meetings (4th Tuesday) well attended. He has condensed facilities from 54 to 50 so it looks a little bit smaller but it is just that he has condensed the facilities with men and women into just one. The Spanish-speaking women meeting in Elmwood is up and running at 2/days per month and working to a total of 3. The Chair is going to be moving out of town in June so the co-chair, Michael Stevens will be taking over the position. **Area 72-** Michael has been working with the Intergroup's Salinas and Monterey bringing flyers to recruit more H&I reps from the groups he's also having very successful orientation meetings at 6:30 PM and they meet the first Thursday of the month, also they will be hosting the February General meeting of 2021 they're looking at having a discussion topic about collecting funds like area 73 does receiving the contributions to one box PO Box and then send one check to the general committee that's a discussion topic that they're going to be having so they can have more information on that soon. **Area 73 Santa Cruz.** Area just had elections on the last fourth Wednesday of the month. Mark Brown is no longer the chair. **Area 74 San Benito.** Just met with the new Area Chair, Peggy Rothermel. I would like to thank Secretary Marti for reaching out to Peggy. The former chair Nen Donato will serve as Literature chair.

Region 80- Southern Int: Kevin Weakland (absent and no report).

**Region 90:** Far Southern Int: Joe Gomez. Area 91- Madera/Mariposa, Miki Smith. Madera is a large geographical area and currently serving CCWF and local jail. Area 92- Fresno: Kat Cruz. Currently going through re-construction of its leadership. A new Chair and Recording Secretary have been elected. Members are currently serving local men's and women's jail as well as local recovery group, West Care. In April, Area invited Marcel A. of SF to speak at our local Intergroup Speaker Meeting. Area 93- Tulare: Joyce Rauen. Area is taking off under new leadership, Joyce R, Area Chair and Bill H, Corcoran Facility Coordinator. Area 95- Kings: OPEN. No activity directly reported. Going to visit that area to get some interest/momentum. Some members have contacted Bill H in regards to service in Corcoran.

#### Region 160: Spanish North Coast: Jose Castellanos (absent, written report)

Meetings are held the 4th Saturday of every month, 10-12 at Grupo Menlo Park, Redwood City; Casa Aztlan on Tuesday, Maple Correctional Facility on Wednesday. We are waiting for the San Francisco Sheriff's dept response for San Bruno Jail. We have a motion about our region. It's too big in those areas for people that are further north, so possibly consider dividing it or find a better solution to bring the message.

#### Region 170- Spanish South Coast: Rogelio Bonilla (absent, no report)

**Region 180-** Spanish Central Int: Eduardo Perez. Meetings held 1st Tuesday of the month. We are in constant communication with Spanish Intergroup and support Atwater Federal Prison, DVI, Sierra Conservation Center, CHCF, San Joaquin Jail and Honor

Farm. A review of the status of our volunteers and the application process is being reviewed by our new Regional Chair, Eduardo. Also, our Spanish Regions 140, 160, 180 and 190 and their prospective Chairs gathered in February to discuss the english online training and issue of language barrier. One solution is to have in-person training or hold a Spanish tutorial in their own regions. We also suggested H&I website translate more content into Spanish to provide more informative, broader information in Hispanic community.

**Region 190- Spanish South Interior, Rafael Flores.** At West Care facility, there are 4 people in attendance every week. Nuestra Cases Recovery, at least 10 attend; Fresno County Jail, there are approximately 25 in attendance every Friday. Chowchilla Women's Prison. About 38 inmates attend; Chowchilla Men's Prison, about 50 inmates in the gym and another 50 attend in the visiting room. We visit 6 AA groups every month.

#### MAJOR INSTITUTION

**ASP Avenal, Doug Goodall.** Per Carl, Bill Hatzman and Doug said that some of the Cochoran volunteers are being shared and bringing in literature.

CCC Susanville, Raymond Laurie. Status quo since last report. Spotty, many lockdowns and few volunteers.

**CCWF & VSP Chowchilla, Miki Smith.** 6 meetings for the general population, B, C, D yard and Visiting Facilities for Spanish speaking. We support the SNIFF (Hospice) unit at the hospital and an EOP unit. We have sponsorship meetings and include active sponsors for other inmates. We are planning meetings for 9 inmates at the firehouse (prison facilitated). 2 english and 2 spanish speaking. More in the clearance training process. An informational fair is being scheduled. Valley State prison for men, 160 rack-credited programs and 30 more being implemented within 2 months. 26 AA per week. 2 english and 1 spanish speaking volunteers.

**CHCF Stockton:** Melody Tolmie. After a facility cancellation of all the old tags in December. Meetings resumed in January, all going smoothly. Groups at CHCF, interest in the Grapevine and includes how to write stories. 2 meetings per day except Thursday. Still need volunteers.

**CMF California Medical Facility, Vacaville CA Ken Monson.** There are 28 meetings/mo occurring inside CMF. Currently all meetings are being covered with outside H&I volunteer participation. In 11/19, we started attending an AA meeting that has been going on for some time without outside volunteer participation in a section of prison outside the fence, known as . "The Ranch". For the last three months, outside volunteers have been running the meeting in an attempt to demonstrate "how" AA meetings are conducted. We will ask for an inside member to become the meeting secretary and take responsibility for the running of the meeting. We are engaged to increase communication specific to AA volunteers showing up for their commitments and being turned away due to understaffing issues. We are also somewhat frustrated with the facility for lack of communication in regard to volunteer clearances, when they expire, and the procedure to keep them current.

#### CTF Soledad: Peter Ortez

3 facilities at CTF. **North:** has special needs inmates. 4 meetings /mo (2 Spanish/2 English). Prison is adding 2 more meetings (both are english). We only have 2 volunteers to go in on 4th Wednesday and need more Spanish & English speaking volunteers. On 06/28, we are holding a 4th Step Workshop. Pete Feliciano is flying in from NY to present. **Central:** 12 meetings, excluding the 4 meetings that the Venture Group. The prison officials are treating The Venture Group as a whole different branch of AA. Of the 12 meetings, we have 6 volunteers. Spanish meetings do not have any volunteers. Prison officials are separating the Suenos and Bulldogs Groups. They are starting a new Spanish-speaking meeting on Thursday, one group will attend Wednesday's meeting and one group will attend Thursday's meeting. **South:** 11 meetings and going smoothly with plenty of volunteers. Providing a 4th Step Workshop as well. Online Orientation has had difficulties since some members are not proficient in computers. They have no Spanish online orientation which is a major problem but a volunteer has taken 4 volunteers to his house to help them through the online process. In November, the CRM office had a workshop and orientation at the prison. We sent 10 people and as of yet, none have been cleared because the camera is broken. They are getting a new camera. Spoke with CRM and they will have 2 onsite orientations (March 2020 and October 2020), but no confirmed dates. Currently in the process of getting a coordinator for each of the 3 facilities. They will report to me. I found 2 coordinators (1 in South and 1 for Central) and I will cover North.

**DVI Tracy: Kevin Weakland.** (absent). Woody provided a report. Self-help groups have been disorganized, so movement with Community Partnership managers to organize all 12 step groups. Now, close to 90 inmates are attending and expanding. Executive Board meeting held quarterly to assist bring coordinators, volunteers, inmate leads for better communication. We will be providing training for inmate leads.

**FCI Dublin: Linda Spencer** (absent). 2 meetings, both on Monday-1 at Camp (minimum Security) and 1 at Medium Security site. Each meeting is literature-based format- read, then discuss. Attendance ranges from 4 to 15, depending on inmate population, consistency of meetings and concurrent competing programs. Challenges are lack of volunteers and having prison escorts. But they

are denying training for new volunteers. Scheduling of required annual training refresher only during the weekday has precluded some volunteers that work during the day to attend, thus badges are not renewed. The prison is not inviting any new volunteers- no training, no clearance. So, those volunteers we lost are not being replaced.

We have a total of 9 volunteers for 8 or 10 meetings per month. Only 2 of the meetings at each facility are covered (3rd & 4th at Camp and 1st at Medium). At least 2 at each are dark. There is a prison staff volunteer manager who has to run from FCI to Camp and back to escort them to and from their meetings. The possible reason for no new volunteers could be economic (cost of bading and annual luncheon). I am encouraging our volunteers to be as flexible as possible. I have noticed that the Monday night religious services have the same volunteers go into minimum and medium security. It may be that the prison thinks AA should do so as well.

#### FCI Herlong, OPEN. It is administered by Nevada Intergroup

**FCI Mendota: Rodney Lawley.** Still need more volunteers. The prison has begun mandatory Narcotics Classes for all inmates who are in for drug cases. They are necessary for the inmate to be considered for Parole. The time and place has had some effect on his AA group but generally attendance is good. In the future, inmates attending AA can earn time off their sentences. The date and amount of time off still to be determined.

#### FSP Folsom, Andrew Burkard (no report)

HDSP Susanville, Raymond Laurie. Due to so many lockdowns, and so spread out, but he is supporting it as best as possible.

**MCSP Mule Cree, Mike Kelley.** A new Community Projects Manager took over at Mule Creek State Prison 2 weeks ago. Previously, no CPM for the last 2 months. As a result of a CPM absence and certain personnel changes, AA meeting schedules in the facility have been slightly disrupted. Since CPM is here, meeting schedules seem to be back on track and will be setting up meeting with them soon. 2 new volunteers began attending meetings within the last two (2) weeks and I have given out 3 more applications to prospective volunteers. I anticipate that working with the new prison staff to improve communications with the inside staff sponsors and myself.

Napa State Hospital: John Glaser. (absent, written report). All meetings (held on Wednesdays) are covered and going well.

NCYC Stockton: OPEN. Possibly re-engaging activity in this facility. Facility is mainly drug offenders, age 18-25.

#### NorCal Fire Camp, Peter Sanderson (absent, no report)

**PBSP Pelican Bay, Cindy Boozer** (absent, written). 4 meetings per week until all volunteers are cleared and trained. 2 new volunteers and have submitted 6 new members for clearance. Thanks to Kelly B for her kindness and knowledge, processed the first order!

**PVSP Coalinga, Tommy Redwine.** (absent, written). Meetings held the 3rd Thursday/mo @ 6 pm. We invited 4 cell blocks, attendance of 20. 3 AA's cleared for attendance. 3 of us attended A yard in January. We are invited into 4 cell blocks with an average attendance of 20. 3 AA's cleared for attendance. We need about 15 AA's to support PVSP meetings.

**CSP Sacramento, John Carboch** (same as last month Steering Committee report). Many lockdown incidences.

**SATF & COR Corcoran, Bill Hatzman. SATF:** We recently increased our monthly commitments at SATF to 12, by adding 2 spanish speaking. Meetings held on Mon-Wed and led by 7 of the 24 volunteers presently cleared. **COR:** 4 meetings led by 2 of 19 volunteers. We have very good relations with CRM staff. We are transitioning our renewing volunteers from Gate Access to Brown Card holders which will extend their access from 12 months to 5 years! COR is still issuing 12 month Brown Cards after a year of volunteer service on their Gate Clearance roster. Volunteer Advisory Committee meetings have not been held since 3/21/19. We have had 3 interim CRM's there since spring 2019. Thankfully we've experienced no meaningful challenges as a result. **Avenal:** 4 of our volunteers have also been approved to serve at Avenal SP with Doug Goodall. We delivered a large literature shipment with Doug on Tuesday, Jan 21.

**SCC Jamestown, Jason Crow.** (absent). 1 meeting/week with 1 other volunteer. Lack of CRM participation, makes it difficult. Carl will go up and meet with Jason and the prison. Will take some work to get up and running again.

**SOL Solano, Lidya Padilla**. (present). Everything is the same as the last report in January. 12 meetings per week to cover (1 Spanish), despite lack of volunteers, we have been able to cover the meetings. We were told to expect changes for 2020. They plan on adding more educational classes. Application and online training not in spanish, so causing issues.

**SQ San Quentin:** Bob Wright (written). It's been an eventful 4 months at the prison. There were a couple of lockdowns, numerous incarcerated AA members got out, and we have had problems with coverage with Spanish Speaking meetings. Continued issues with lack of volunteers, and those with gate clearances haven't renewed them. There are 4 Spanish speaking BC holders, one of whom doesn't speak any english, so communication can be difficult. After discussion with numerous people within the H&I structure, we talked about the process of going from 2 spanish speaking meetings/week to 1. Shout out to Raymundo L. We have other bilingual volunteers who have agreed to step up on Saturdays, and so we will NOT be cutting down the meetings after all.

The CRM just advised that beige card anniversary documents and online training will be due at the holder's birth month rather than the anniversary of BC issuance. Online training has gone RELATIVELY smoothly. They anticipate doing in person training quarterly.

**SVSP Soledad:** Allison Goss (Present) 6 yards, 1 is minimum security 5 are level 4. Typically 2 yards are down each week. 27 volunteers, 19 that are participating. Need more volunteers due to covering 6 yards. Because of Prop 57, we are getting few alcoholics coming to meetings and more coming to get the rack points. We asked the Warden for an AA non-racked meeting, it was well received, so started a new meeting.

USP Atwater: Dawn Trook (absent). No report received, per Carl said should be the same as last month

#### LIAISONS

**VATF -Carl Price.** No meeting since last time, but there was discussion about the need of spanish online trainings. A very big need. We need to get the Form 2's in!

**H&I Liaison to CNCA - Karen Bertolini.** The scheduled meetings were disrupted due to the displacement caused by the fire. Assembly coming up in April.
